

Re Chicago teletype dated 2/25/66, concerning KING's plans to be in NYC on 2/25 - 26/66.

*b7(D)* [redacted] advised that KING and BERNARD LEE checked in at the hotel at 3:00 PM, 2/25/66, although he had no reservations.

In an effort to determine whether KING met with any individuals in whom the Bureau has an interest, surveillances were conducted in the lobby of the hotel on 2/25 - 26/66. However, these agents failed to observe anyone in whom there is an interest.

*b7(D)* [redacted] advised that KING and party checked out of the hotel at 6:00 PM on Saturday 2/26/66.

Confidential sources of the NYO, who furnish information concerning STANLEY LEVISON and CLARENCE JONES and their involvement in racial matters, furnished no information which indicated contact with these men and KING. (S)

ReCGtel 2/24/66 relating details of assumption of "trusteeship" of slum building by King.

Chicago requested to expeditiously furnish the Bureau complete details regarding above matter in form suitable for dissemination. The Bureau is especially desirous of knowing if there is any indication that King's action was influenced by any subversive organizations or individuals and if any subversive organizations or individuals are taking part in renovation of the building seized by King.

Chicago will continue to closely follow all activities of King and King's organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, in Chicago and will immediately furnish the Bureau, in form suitable for dissemination, any information developed indicating that any subversive organizations or individuals are influencing, directing, guiding or participating in the Southern Christian Leadership Conference program in Chicago.

NOTE:

King and his organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, have selected Chicago as the site of the first northern invasion of the SCLC. SCLC leaders feel the future of the organization depends on its success in Chicago. They have embarked on an ambitious campaign to improve conditions for Negroes in Chicago. Retel reports that King has seized control of a slum dwelling and is proceeding to renovate it without consent of the

LOCAL NEWS MEDIA REPORTING CIVIL RIGHTS GROUPS LED BY KING CONTINUED WITHOUT INTERFERENCE RENOVATION OF WEST SIDE "SLUM BUILDING" AT ONE THREE TWO ONE SOUTH HOMAN AVENUE, CHICAGO. FURTHER LOCAL JUDGES, LAWYERS AND REAL ESTATE OFFICIALS BLASTED AS ILLEGAL THE ACTION OF KING IN ASSUMING WHAT THEY CALLED "TRUSTEESHIP" OF BUILDING. USDC JUDGE JAMES B. PARSONS QUOTED IN PART AS STATING "I DON'T THINK IT IS LEGAL; IT IS THEFT". ALSO "I AM NOT IN AGREEMENT WITH CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE OR THE FLOUNTING OF GOOD LAWS. THIS IS A REVOLUTIONARY TACTIC".

[REDACTED] ADVISED TODAY THAT KING ATTENDED NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING, NORTH SIDE CHURCH, LATE P.M. FEBRUARY TWENTY THREE LAST, PREVIOUSLY ADVERTISED AS MEETING CONCERNED PARENTS JENNER SCHOOL. KING SPOKE BRIEFLY, URGED UNITY AMONG ALL LOCAL CIVIL RIGHTS GROUPS.

ON FEBRUARY TWENTY THREE LAST, KING ANNOUNCED SCLC "ASSUMED TRUSTEESHIP" OF SLUM BUILDING, ONE THREE TWO ONE SOUTH HOMAN, WITH CCCO AND WEST SIDE ORGANIZATION (WSO). RENTS OF FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS MONTHLY WILL BE COLLECTED BY THESE GROUPS TO BE USED TO CLEAN AND RENOVATE BUILDING. KING UNDECIDED WHETHER MORTGAGE PAYMENTS TO BE MADE. ACTION CALLED "SUPRA - LEGAL" BY KING, WITH MORAL QUESTION SUPERSEDING LEGAL. KING AND RABY LED SUBSEQUENT CLEANUP OF BUILDING, LEGAL ACTION FROM OWNER ANTICIPATED BY SCLC.

[REDACTED] advised that on 2/3/66 Martin Luther King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), met with Reverend John P. Cody, Archbishop of the Chicago Diocese of the Roman Catholic Church. The meeting was in the nature of a courtesy visit, at King's request, during which King reportedly informed the Archbishop of the nature and purpose of his campaign to end segregation and discrimination against the Negro in Chicago. King has selected Chicago to be the site of the first SCLC invasion into the northern civil rights problem. It is recognized by King that the future of his organization may well rest in the success or failure of the SCLC Chicago program.

King stated at a press conference, after his meeting with the Archbishop, that he and Archbishop Cody were in substantial agreement upon the goals they were both seeking and intended to keep in touch with each other. King declared he was hopeful of the active participation of priests and nuns in connection with his SCLC program in Chicago and had gained the impression from the Archbishop that such participation was a matter of individual conscience and would not be a matter of discipline insofar as the Diocesan hierarchy was concerned.

King continues to rely heavily on the advice of his New York foursome, Stanley Levison, Harry Wachtel, Clarence Jones and Bayard Rustin, in connection with all major SCLC problems and activities. These individuals have all been members of the Communist Party or Communist Party front groups in the past. As long as King utilizes these advisors with subversive backgrounds, the danger remains that his SCLC activities will be influenced by communist-oriented thinking. Should communists or communist sympathizers succeed in influencing the SCLC Chicago program, it would be a major breakthrough for the communists in the civil rights field.



King had arrived via Northwest Orient Airlines and anticipated departure on February 11, 1966, from O'Hare, to return to Atlanta.

the civil rights effort here. At his appearance before this group King had also spoken of the necessity for the SCLC campaign in Chicago as the recently passed civil rights statutes, as well as Supreme Court decisions, have done little or nothing to grapple with the problems of the millions of Negroes in the North. "We're here to stay until slums are removed from the Windy City" King stated.

According to an article in the "Chicago Tribune", another Chicago newspaper, edition of February 11, 1966, concerning this affair, other speakers had been identified as Edwin C. Berry, Head of the Chicago Urban League, Al Raby, Convenor of the Coordinating Council of Community Organizations (CCCO) and Reverend Ralph Abernathy, identified as Vice-President, SCLC. The article also reflected that on February 10, 1966 Abernathy was scheduled to move into an adjoining apartment to that of Dr. King at 1550 South Hamlin Street, Chicago. Subsequent to this luncheon, according to this article, King and a group of advisers had again toured the slum areas near his apartment at 1550 South Hamlin, and listened to the grievances of Negro tenants here, regarding such matters as lack of heat, broken windows, walls with fallen plaster and the like.

Regarding King's appearance in Bloomington, Illinois, note that the February 9, 1966 edition of the "Chicago Sun-Times" reflected that King was to appear at 8:00 p.m., February 10, 1966 on the campus of Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington.

The "Chicago Sun-Times" edition of February 12, 1966 contained an article reflecting that on the previous day, February 11, 1966, King had appeared before a group of some 200 clergymen at the Jubilee Temple, Christian Methodist Church, 114 East 59th street. King had requested support for his so-called "Operation Breadbasket", the term given to an attempt of the SCLC to increase job opportunities for Negroes through negotiation with employers, backed by the threat of boycott and picketing. A committee of 20 ministers was selected to determine such specific employers in Chicago towards whom

such an effort might be directed, that is areas where much Negro money is spent but where Negro employment is minimal or primarily in low level custodial type jobs. Those firms which do not respond to negotiations will face "economic penalties" meaning primarily an economic boycott of their products or merchandise.

The article continued that King had also noted during his remarks before this group that there was a real possibility he would remain in Chicago, together with his SCLC campaign here, for a year and one-half to pursue his program of equality for the Negro. He advised that in this regard there was a possibility that as time went on he might move from his apartment on Chicago's west side to one on Chicago's south side, the latter also to be an area of concentration for his program here.

On February 14, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Martin Luther King (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC), and Stanley Levison were in conference on that date. The purpose of their contact was to give Levison an opportunity to get King's comments concerning a telegram Levison had prepared to send to Trade Unions. The telegram, according to the information furnished by the source, was in essence as follows: (S)

"Historic opportunities to liberalize the South through Negro voter registration are at point of climax. SCLC is deploying maximum resources in Alabama and Registration books close in thirty days, emphasizing need for all out effort now. Simultaneously, we are leading Chicago assault on slums - we are collaborating with Trade Unions there to organize hospital and laundry workers. Significant breakthroughs for democratic rights can be made in next weeks. I know you will understand urgency and help significantly as you have before. Please send to my attention, Martin Luther King, Jr., c/o SCLC, Atlanta" (S)



At King's suggestion, Levison changed the telegram to make a direct appeal for financial support instead of just asking for help in general. (S)

Levison said he had selected about 15 to 20 unions to receive copies of the telegram. (S)

Following the telegram matter, the conversation shifted to the SCLC's drive to eradicate slums in Chicago. In this regard, King said Mayor Daley of Chicago held a Press conference on Thursday (February 10, 1966), and from the statements made, one would think that he (King) had held the conference. According to King, Daley, in response to a question as to whether he was feeling pressure from the SCLC's drive, stated that he was not, that the changes announced by him (Daly), had been planned for months. (S)

Levison, after hearing King's statement, said he was of the opinion that the public is becoming aware of King's efforts in Chicago as they did in Montgomery, Alabama, many years ago. And as a consequence, changes will occur, Levison predicted. (S)

On February 11, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which disclosed that Stanley Levison and Adele Kanter (Director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC office in New York City) were in contact on that date regarding SCLC operational matters. In that regard, they discussed the recent fund raising affair which was held by the SCLC at the Riverside Church, New York City on January 2, 1966.

Levison said that as a consequence of the poor reception on the part of the ministers who attended the function, it has been decided that in the future, contacts will be made on an individual basis rather than on a mass basis. In pointing out just how disappointing the Riverside results were, Levison said only eight pledges were received.

Bill Stein (Church fund raiser for the SCLC), Levison said, spent two months making plans for the Riverside Church function, although Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC)

had opposed the function. Levison said he now concurs with King that it is a waste of time and effort to hold big affairs similar to the Riverside one. (S)

Furthermore, Levison also agrees with King when he contends that <sup>more</sup> contributions are received from contacts by William Stein with individuals and specific churches than from mass meetings (S)

On February 14, 1966, the same source advised that Levison and Kanter were in contact on that date, during which time Levison told Kanter what transpired at the emergency SCLC financial meeting which was held in Atlanta, Georgia, on February 12, 1966. First, Levison said, the meeting was a very good one and said the financial difficulties of the SCLC were squarely handled. He said he (Levison) asked that the program of the SCLC be curtailed, which drew the ire of King, who opposed any curtailment. (S)

In elaborating on some of the things considered and acted upon, Levison said Harry Belafonte was recently in Europe to set up an SCLC benefit affair in Sweden, Norway and Paris. Levison said the benefit planned for Sweden would be fantastic because the Prime Minister would be the Chairman, the Post Office in Sweden would handle the affair, and the National Treasury would handle the money. Levison said the Swedish banks were paying the expenses of the affair, and "they" (the SCLC) expected to net \$200,000. (S)

Levison mentioned that Clarence Jones, who also attended the Atlanta meeting, announced that the SCLC had received only \$25,000 from the Teamsters Union, although officials had made great promises subsequent to the murder of Mrs. Viola Liuzzo in Alabama, last year. (S)

King, Levison said, in remarking on Jones' statement, said when he was returning from the Liuzzo funeral, James Hoffa (President of the Teamsters) and Harold Gibbons of the Teamsters, told him they would raise a very large sum for the SCLC. (S)

Levison said Jones is a very close friend of one of the top attorneys of the Teamsters Union, Sidney Cohn (Phonetic), therefore, he should try to tread his way and see if he can get something going in order to get the funds promised. (S)

In considering other means to raise funds, Levison said Chauncey Eskridge (Attorney and legal adviser to the SCLC) came up with the idea of a radio program for King. The program as envisioned by Eskridge, would be for ten minutes on Sunday mornings, and "they" would sell two spots before and after, get a sponsor and make an appeal on the air to Negroes. Levison said he disagreed wholeheartedly with the idea, however, over his opposition, it was agreed that Dr. Billy Graham's (noted evangelist) experts would help them get the project off the ground. (S)

In order to cover back bills of the SCLC, Levison said it was agreed that an emergency approach would be made to churches and labor unions. In addition, according to Levison, \$30,000 will be borrowed to help clear the bills. (S)

The reserve fund, according to Levison, contains about \$34,000 plus another reserve which they don't want to touch. In addition, there are stocks in a well known mutual fund amounting to \$100,000. Levison said if necessary, they could borrow on them in order to pay off the bills. (S)

Levison said the SCLC has expectations to raise money in Chicago, Illinois, and the trade unions <sup>are</sup> expected to raise between \$50,000 and \$100,000 in that city. An affair being run by them (SCLC) in Chicago, is expected to net \$80,000 and a dinner is expected to raise a large amount of money since they already have \$35,000 in pledges. (S)

One point proposed by him was accepted during the meeting, Levison told Kanter. He said it was agreed that the SCLC should pin point every area in which it expects to raise money, then appoint one person to be the supervisor in charge in that area. He said he came up with the responsibility for Al Duckett (public relations man in New York City who handles King's promotional activities) due to the fact that Billy Eckstine (noted male singer) was desirous of a five city tour to raise money for the SCLC and that it was a Duckett operation. Levison said he would supervise the money Duckett spends on the arrangements for the proposed Eckstine tour. (S)



b7(D) [REDACTED] advised that Martin Luther King, Jr. arrived at the Bloomington, Illinois Airport from Chicago, Illinois at 8 PM by chartered plane on February 10, 1966.

[REDACTED] advised that at the Illinois Wesleyan University Field House, Bloomington, Illinois, King addressed approximately 3,000 people, composed preponderantly of student and faculty members from Illinois Wesleyan University and Illinois State University, Normal, Illinois. He related there was a sprinkling of townspeople in attendance.

The "Daily Panagraph", a daily newspaper published at Bloomington, Illinois, in the issue printed the morning of February 11, 1966, stated that King reported on civil rights gains.

The same news article said King stated "If democracy is to live, segregation must die". He reported that the average negro who is employed today "Earns ten times more than the average negro wage earner twelve years ago." He further stated "Twenty per cent of the negro families earn less than \$1,000 annually compared against five per cent of the white families in the same category."

The same news article stated that King stated "While this nation faces the lowest level of unemployment in the last seven or eight years", he pointed out, "unemployment among negroes is at its highest level". Also, he stressed the need for public work programs.

The article further stated that King related that a psychological change is needed "One of the tragedies of

slum life is that it causes people to lose faith and resign themselves to fate."

The article went on to state that after King spoke for nearly an hour, he engaged in fifteen minutes of answering questions and stated he had to end his meeting early as he was needed in Chicago, Illinois at 11 PM, February 10, 1966, to plan strategy for a union to end slums in Chicago, Illinois.

b7(D) [REDACTED] advised that immediately subsequent to his speech, King departed from Bloomington, Illinois by chartered private plane en route Chicago, Illinois. He advised the plane left the Bloomington, Illinois Airport at 10:15 PM, February 10, 1966.

Labor Secretary W. WILLIAM PEARCE is to send a task force to investigate charges of discriminatory practices in the building trades in the East St. Louis area and, if possible, demonstrations want to be avoided.

According to [REDACTED] contractors and union representatives were requested to meet with the NAACP officials, including [REDACTED] National NAACP Labor Secretary. The meeting is set for 2 p.m., Wednesday, February 9, 1968. According to [REDACTED], 32 letters were sent to various representatives inviting them to the meeting and if they did not appear a demonstration would be scheduled for 8 a.m., February 10, 1968, and the target for the demonstration would be the new Federal Building under construction in the 300 block of Missouri Avenue, East St. Louis, Illinois. According to [REDACTED] no "lie-ins" were planned but peaceful picketing would take place, including a march from downtown East St. Louis.

He said the card was mailed from Springfield, Illinois, and bore the return address of the American Opinion, Belmont, Massachusetts. On this card was a handprinted note which read "Call 525-1717".

[REDACTED] advised that upon telephoning that phone number this number was determined to be a recording which apparently was somewhat of a character assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He said various members of the NAACP and others of the Negro race in Springfield have received these postcards and are somewhat up in arms about them. He said while nothing has taken place yet obviously this matter will be discussed at the next meeting of the NAACP in an effort to get the recording stopped and the person responsible for it prosecuted for any possible violation of law that can be developed.

In connection with recent Atlanta and New York communications reflecting KING planned to meet in Chicago on Friday, February 4, 1966, with BAYARD RUSTIN, of New York, there has been no information forthcoming from any sources normally utilized in this matter indicating that such a meeting took place or that RUSTIN was in Chicago.

No reference was made in the enclosed LHM concerning information provided by [REDACTED] 2/3/66, and included in Chicago teletype of 2/3/66. This information would add nothing to the LHM and the NOI interest in KING's appearance was solely from a standpoint of observing what transpired, as was later clarified by this source on 2/3/66. b(2) b7(D)

As Chicago teletype of 2/3/66 reflected, the information provided by the source re the NOI interest in KING's appearance, because of its proximity to the residence of the NOI leader, was furnished immediately in paraphrased form to the office of the Deputy Superintendent, Chicago Police Department.

[REDACTED] advised the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on February 2, 1966, that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. had arrived in Chicago at approximately 5:50 PM on that date via Trans-World Airlines from New York City, New York. Upon arrival, King had indicated his intention of residing while in Chicago at the apartment recently rented for him in a Chicago slum area on the west side; that is, 1550 South Hamlin Avenue, Chicago.

[REDACTED] advised the Chicago Office of the FBI on February 3, 1966, that during the morning hours of this date Dr. King had met for approximately one and one-half hours with the Reverend John P. Cody, Archbishop of the Chicago Catholic Archdiocese. The meeting had been in the nature of a courtesy visit, at King's request, during the course of which King reportedly had informed Archbishop Cody of the nature and purposes of his campaign to end segregation and discrimination against the Negro here in Chicago. [REDACTED] advised that King had stated in a press conference shortly after this meeting that he and Archbishop Cody were in substantial agreement upon the goals that both were seeking and intended to keep in touch with each other. King stated that he was hopeful of the active participation of priests and nuns in connection with his Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) program here and had gained the impression from the Archbishop that such participation was a matter of individual conscience and would not be a matter of discipline insofar as the church hierarchy in this archdiocese was concerned. King had been accompanied to this conference by Reverend Andrew Young and Bernard Lee, both officials of Dr. King's SCLC.

ILL [REDACTED] advised on February 4, 1966, that King had appeared as scheduled the previous evening at a rally at the Kenwood United Church of Christ, 4608 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago. This rally was held under the auspices of the Kenwood-Oakland Community Organization, the Woodlawn Organization, and the Unity Organization for Hyde Park High School, all described as local neighborhood civil ILL rights and community improvement type groups. During his remarks here King had attacked the recent decision of the Chicago Board of Education to build a new high school in the Hyde Park-Kenwood community area, rather than in enlarging the existing Hyde Park High School. The sponsoring organizations, as well as a number of other neighborhood groups, feel that a new high school constructed in this area will create more segregated school conditions by drawing from the existing Hyde Park High School the few white students remaining in the area. King in his remarks supported this thesis and stated that the weight of his SCLC forces here would be thrown behind those in opposition to the Board of Education decision.

In connection with the above appearance at the Kenwood Church, an article in the February 4, 1966, edition of the "Chicago's American", a daily Chicago newspaper, reflected the facts of this threat, also stated that King's appearance at this particular meeting had been against his local doctor's orders as he was suffering from an attack of bronchitis. This article stated that the possibility existed King would have to curtail his Chicago activities during the next day or so because of his physical condition.

[REDACTED] advised the Chicago Office on February 7, 1966, that Dr. King had appeared as scheduled at the so-called Rally to End Slums, February 5, 1966, at the Mozart Baptist Church, 2900 West Adams Street. King's comments here were very brief and King appeared to be suffering the effects of his recent illness. Approximately 1,000 persons were present and heard King urge Chicago's slum dwellers to organize to end the conditions under which they live. He urged the formation of action units, or unions, to gain the necessary numerical strength to bargain with the forces responsible for these slum conditions. King charged that too many Negro slum residents have become satisfied with their conditions and adjusted to them. [REDACTED] continued that earlier reports had been made to this meeting by study groups on education, economics, housing and politics. Reverend James Bevel, SCLC Staff Worker in Chicago, had urged continuing organizational efforts in all these categories and suggested that the formation of slum tenant councils will commence in the near future.

[REDACTED] advised on February 7, 1966, that apart from the telephone threat to the Kenwood Church on the evening of February 3, 1966, there had been no incidents or disorders of any kind in connection with the presence of King in Chicago during the period February 2-5, 1966.

On February 9, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison and Adele Kanter (Director of the New York Office of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC), were in contact on that date. According to the source, their principal concern was financial matters of the SCLC. (S)

Levison, in emphasizing just how shakey the SCLC's financial position is, said it is so bad that Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC) called an emergency meeting of the SCLC for Saturday, February 12, 1966, in Atlanta, Georgia. He acknowledged, however, that King showed vision in recognizing the danger signs before it becomes too late. (S)

In order to try to project just what the expenses and receipts of the SCLC would be for the current fiscal period, Levison said he was of the opinion that between \$350,000 and \$400,000 gross would be taken in from their mailings. He said expenses would run about \$110,000. (S)

Levison repeated that he felt they could get gross of \$400,000 or 40 per cent of the budget from their mail appeals. He noted that there is a weakness in that "they" (SCLC) are counting on getting \$150,000 from benefits, although there are no benefits scheduled, and the balance (of the budget) from the American Foundation for Non-Violence. (S)

On February 8, 1966, a confidential source, who has  
shown reliable information in the past, advised that  
Ray Lawson and Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC),  
in contact on that date and discussed what King described  
as an emergency meeting of the SCLC. The meeting, according to  
the source, will be held in Atlanta, Georgia, on Saturday,  
February 12, 1966, and will be concerned with financial  
difficulties being experienced by the SCLC. In pointing out  
how bad conditions are in the SCLC, King said only about two  
or three hundred dollars a day in donations were received  
during the last two weeks, although the back debts of the  
SCLC exceeded \$50,000 and are continuing.

Lawson told King that he was not surprised that he  
called the meeting because he was convinced when he was  
in Atlanta, that an emergency crisis meeting would have  
been called. He said he saw at that time that the financial  
state was not sound. King concurred, expressing concern and  
worry, that he just could not have the problem hanging over  
his head while he was trying to do a job in Chicago and  
elsewhere. He said since he was away from SCLC headquarters  
most of the time, he had to devise a sounder way of operating.  
Lawson agreed, remarking that "you either have to relate your  
expenditures to your realistic income or you have to have trouble".



Levison said, however, that money would start coming in now and would continue quite well for the next two months. He said that was due to the fact that "their" (SCLC) most solid mail appeal had just gone out several days ago.

Levison inquired if Harry Wachtel and Clarence Jones be in attendance at the meeting. King said he had not invited them and asked Levison if he should contact them. Although Levison did not answer specifically, he said he was of the opinion that Wachtel had grossly overstated the amount of money he could raise; that he did not believe Wachtel had made a realistic estimate of what he could raise. Levison said he did not know whether this meeting would be the appropriate one for King to have Wachtel, but said he (King) must soon sit down with Wachtel and find out just what he can raise. King said he had not talked with Wachtel in several weeks and asked if he was back from his vacation. Levison said he did not know but at King's suggestion, said he would try to reach Wachtel and Jones to get them to go to the meeting.



Chapter of SCLC was held on February 3, 1966, with about fifty persons in attendance. Harry Boyte, of Atlanta, Georgia, was the main speaker. The purpose of the meeting was to raise funds and begin a recruitment drive for people to join SCLC. A. D. Moore, Chairman of the Miami Chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality, was elected as Chairman. Neil Adams, a local Negro leader from the Brownsville Section of Miami, was offered a position in the new chapter, but declined to accept it. It was reported that when 1000 people can be assured of attending a meeting, Martin Luther King, Jr., will be available to address such a group.

Harry Boyte and a friend by the name of William [redacted] (phonetic) reportedly left Miami on February 4, 1966, to return to Atlanta, Georgia. Boyte was driving an AWD rental car, and during his stay in Miami resided at the Miami International Airport Hotel.

On February 7, 1966, MW T-1 advised that at the February 3, 1966, SCLC organizational meeting, A. D. Moore was elected Chairman, along with an Executive Committee consisting of Reverend [redacted], Reverend [redacted], Reverend [redacted], and a Mr. Chapman, who was also elected Treasurer.

Although Moore did not particularly want the Chairmanship, it is understood that he took the position rather than have as Chairman a Cecil D. Rolie who was actively seeking the position. Rolie has a militant and aggressive attitude toward civil rights, and wanted demonstrations, marches, and picketing.

equal employment opportunities for Negroes in those business-  
es which have few, if any, Negro employees, such as the  
large department stores and utility companies.

The hiring of Cubans, rather than Negroes, at  
hotels and motels in this area is also a matter of concern.  
The local chapter may bring this practice of employers
